STRATEGIC PLANNING GOALS

The following short (2010) and mid-term goals have been identified and established by the Chapter Executive Board as action items.

Insurance: Work with National to achieve resolution in the reduction or elimination of additional insurance costs related to Chapter events.

Bylaw Update: Review and modify existing Chapter Bylaws which were last updated in 1993.

Incorporation: Incorporate to add additional benefits and security to our non-profit designation.

Philanthropy: Judiciously consider options for long-term control and distribution of established and solicited funds that are in the best interest of the Chapter.

Event Standard Operational Procedures: Create event SOPs to allow for consistency and continuity of operations from year-to-year.

Chapter Board Member Position Descriptions and Transition Guides: Establish detailed officer PDs to allow for greater operational efficiency and effectiveness through clear delineation of duties and responsibilities of each position. Create secretary's position transition guide that identifies the location of financial, operational, and historical documents.

Past-Presidents Committee: Create a formal and structured standing committee to assist the Chapter Executive Board and Chapter members with projects, programs and solicitation for resources.

Training Committee: Establish a formal and structured standing committee to identify member training needs, procure relevant instructors and related resources. This committee will coordinate with National in the delivery of funded in-state training opportunities for all law enforcement officers.

Communications: Modify the Chapter website to best meet the needs of the membership. Create folders and links that allow for timely and accurate review of committee agendas, minutes, historical data, bylaws, event calendar, contacts, and related member news.

CHAPTER CHAT

Deputy Chief Harold L. Compton
Green Bay Police Department
FBI national Academy Session #73

Harold Compton was born May 25th 1923 and raised in Green Bay Wisconsin. After graduating from Green Bay West High School, Harold enlisted in the United States Army. He served from 1943 through 1946 in the Anti Aircraft Infantry, as an Infantry Squad Leader and 90 mm Gun Commander. Harold was a sharpshooter and participated in several combat missions including New Guinea, East Indies and the Philippines

Harold was appointed Patrolman for the Green Bay Police Department February 21, 1950 leaving a job that paid \$1.39 per hour. He rose through the Department ranks and was appointed Deputy Chief in November of 1967. Harold was the first member of the Department to be invited (by J. Edgar Hoover) to attend the FBI National Academy, Session #73 from August 19, 1963 through November 1963. He retired as Deputy Chief in 1980 after more than 30 years of police service. To this day, Harold continues to participate in the annual FBI re-trainer missing only once since 1980.

Deputy Chief Compton dedicated his career toward advancing the law enforcement profession. Harold left a lasting legacy not only on the Green Bay Police Department but on police agencies throughout the State of Wisconsin. He was the first Green Bay Police Officer to obtain a Bachelors' Degree. For many years he trained officers throughout the state in partnership with the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Wisconsin Chiefs of Police Association and Technical Institutes. In Green Bay, Harold started what is affectionally known as Compton's College, the first "recruit academy" for police recruits. The twelve week Green Bay Academy was one of the first to be certified by the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Standards Board.

Harold still resides in Green Bay with his wife Germaine. They have four children.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Harold started, "Pig out with the pig nights" during the Vietnam protest era. This involved Green Bay Police Officers and UWGB students cooking out and having liquid refreshments at the Student Union. As a result there were never any violent protests in the City of Green Bay. There was one march following the Kent State shootings but Harold and the mayor marched with the students. Harold also started the first "Street Worker" program in which social workers responded to certain calls after they were requested by an officer.

Harold is a man of many talents. When Green Bay was responsible for the entertainment at the retraining sessions, Harold wrote the skits and the songs, played the concertina and somehow convinced Green Bay attendees and many from other agencies to participate (which usually meant dressing in drag.)
